The Future


The summer of 2013 will provide an opportunity for a new group of students to give, share, and receive aspects of music and community present only in the African culture.







How Will We Stay Safe?

In order to go to Kenya, Baylor requires several safety measures including the International SOS, Baylor's own Risk Management forms, and continuous access to safe food and water. In the event of any sudden change in the safety of the country, Baylor has helicopters available to Hilo-lift the group out of the country.

How Will We Raise The Money?

We have received generous gifts for this trip which will significantly reduce the cost for each person. After group fundraising through t-shirts, recordings, African bracelets, concerts, and donations, we hope to lower the cost per person to less than \$2,000.

What Immunizations Will I Need?
